

When one needs to have visible alpha channel (solved)

Usually, when an image with transparency has to be shown in Gimp-chat, this image appears as having a white area around and replacing the transparent pixels.

I mean that when we are explaining the process of an image in the tutorials or when we need to explain something in alpha channel of an image, it is useful to have the alpha channel visible.

For instance, this file/photo has alpha channel. It shows having white zone around of the flower.



For those needs, what I do it is to use a program that allows us to select the image with the visible alpha channel.

I am using "PhotoScape" it is a free program and one of its tools it is a pair of scissors which you can select the desired part of the image with. (There are many more programs similar to this)



In this way we can see as image the alpha channel. But it's a JPG image (not a png file)
