

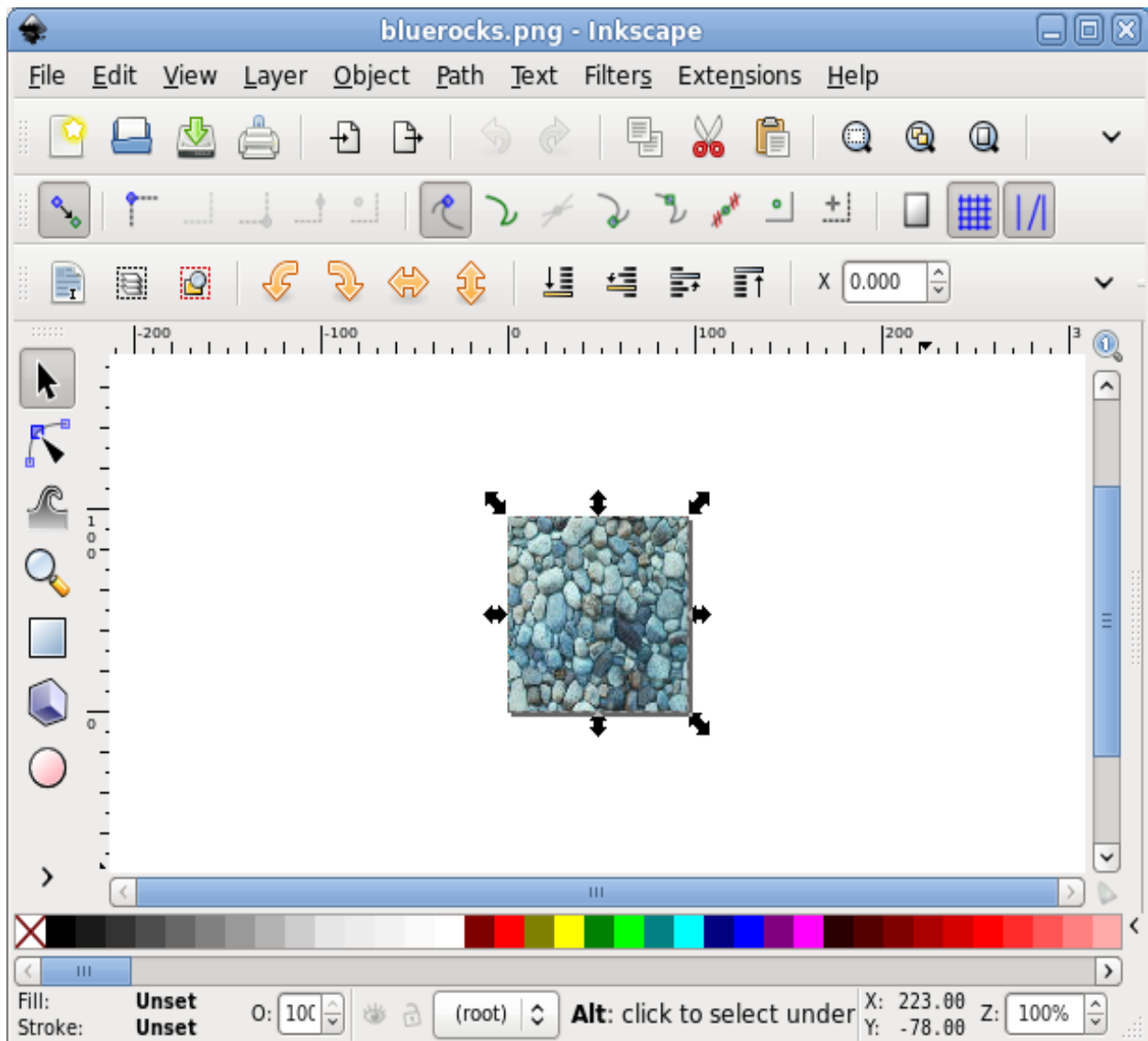
Inkscape is an open source vector image program and is free. Download it at <http://www.inkscape.org>

Resizing an Image in Inkscape

Steps I use resizing an image with Inkscape.

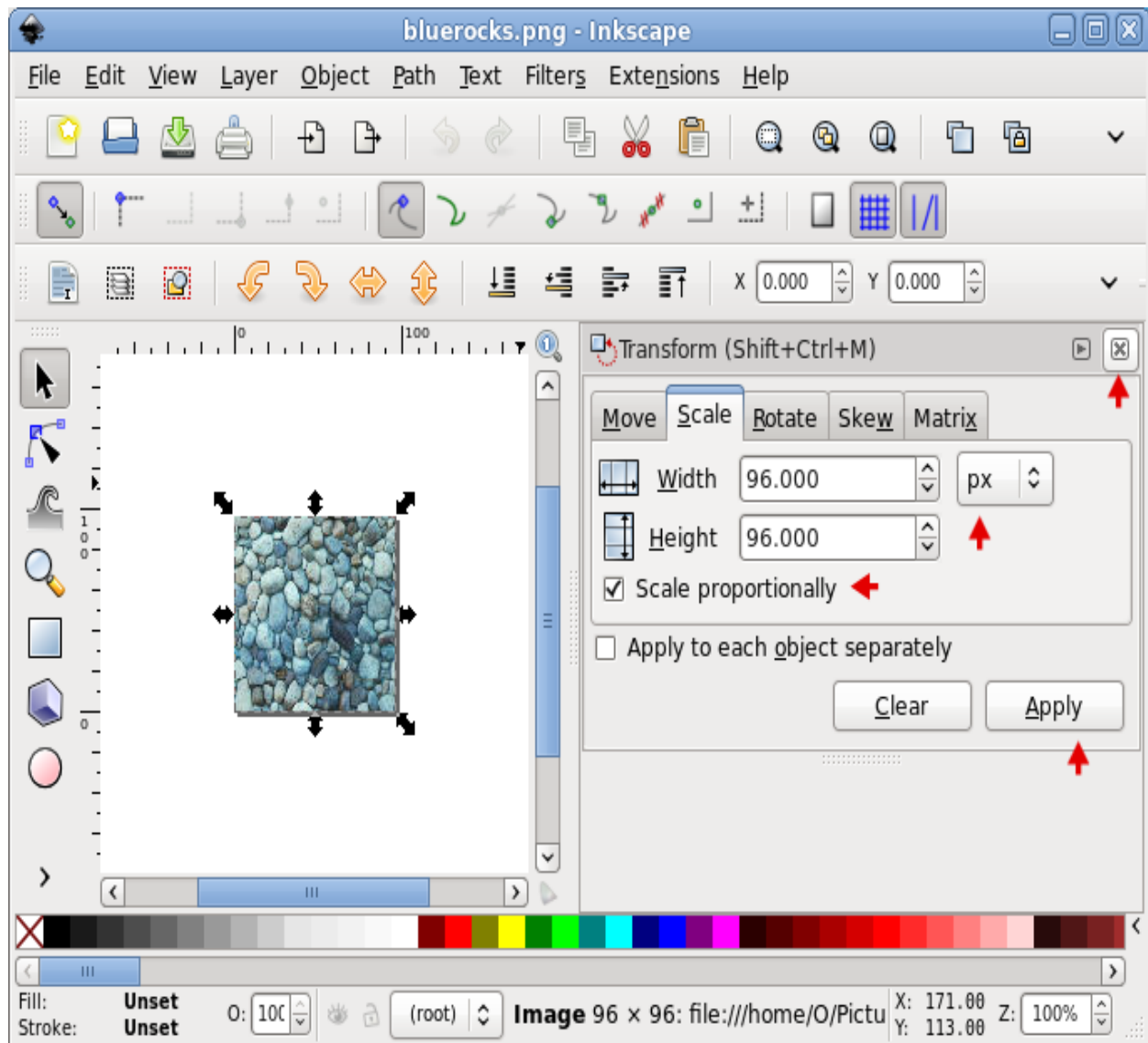
In GIMP

1. Open image, Ctrl + D to duplicate, close original image.
2. Image > Scale Image. Change resolution to 300ppi.
3. Save image as filename.png.



4. Open the image in Inkscape. Click image so arrows are all around it.

5. In Inkscape menu click Object > Transform. Click the Scale tab. Next to Width, click the dropdown that says % and change it to px. Check the box that says Scale Proportionally.



6. Make the Width and Height what you want and click apply. Click the X in the right upper corner to close the Transform dialog. Your image is resized but you need to resize the canvas around it.
7. In the Inkscape Menu click File > Document Properties and about mid-way down, click the bar that says Fit page to selection. Click the X up in the corner of Document Properties to close it.
8. In the Inkscape Menu click File > Export Bitmap. It will rename your image with a number. You can choose to rename it or just leave it as is. Click Export. Close the dialog.
9. Close Inkscape. It will ask you if you want to save it. It's saved. No further saving required.
10. Open the new png image in GIMP.
